## **HU106 Equipment**

## [...]

6. Spurs. Only one spur may be worn on each boot. The contact surface of spurs and all edges must be smooth and rounded made of metal or plastic. Hammer spurs, "impulse spurs" with round knobs, spurs with flat discs, and "dummy spurs" with no shank are permitted. Rowel spurs, with a notched or serrated disc are prohibited. Spurs with a rotating disc that is not notched or serrated are permitted. Spurs must be made of smooth metal or plastic. Rowel spurs with serrated edges are not permitted. Hammer spurs are allowed. Metal or plastic "impulse" spurs with round hard plastic or metal knobs and "Dummy" spurs are allowed. The contact surface with the horse and all edges must be smooth and rounded. Athletes when mounted may wear only one spur on each boot.
