Draft 1: This is in direct conflict with the equipment rules of the FEI, which are followed for Dressage. In addition, there is a concern that allowing bridles without nosebands in USEF licensed competitions would increase the possibility that the bridle might come off the horse, a concern that resulted in the recent amendment of DR 121 to require throatlatches on almost all bridles.

DR121 Saddlery and Equipment

3. Bridle.

Permitted bridles and bits must be used in a conventional manner.

The headstall (except browband) and noseband must be made of leather or leather-like material except the buckles, wear tabs on cheek pieces and reins, and a small disk of sheepskin used at the intersection of the two leather straps of a crossed noseband. Nylon or other non-metallic material may be used to reinforce leather in the headstall but must not come in direct contact with the horse. Elastic inserts are permitted only in the crownpiece and cheekpieces. Bit snaps, buckles, or hooks/studs to attach cheekpieces to the bit are permitted.

d. Noseband. A noseband is optional at Federation run dressage classes, from Introductory Level through Second Level, and required at Third Level through Grand Prix. If a noseband is used, it required and may be a regular cavesson or noseband with an adjustable back piece or chin strap, a dropped noseband, a flash noseband (combination of a cavesson and an attached dropped noseband), or a Mexican (figure-8, crossed) noseband (Figure 121.8) except as prohibited in some competitions (see DR121.3.j). A double bridle must be used with a cavesson with or without an adjustable back piece or chin strap.
