This cross entry sentence is unnecessary and potentially confusing because of the restrictions outlined in .5 of the same rule. There is nothing preventing cross entry for juniors into other sections or classes outside of .5 and the prize list can state cross entry restrictions for any section, not just juniors.

5. Restrictions

a. Any athlete that competes in an FEI Championship for Seniors (i.e. World Equestrian Games, Olympic Games, Pan-American Games, World Cup Finals) is ineligible to compete in any Junior and/or Amateur Jumper class with the same horse for a period of one year.

b. Any athlete that competes in a CSI5*, CSI4*, a CSI-W or CSIO is ineligible to compete in a Junior and/or Amateur Jumper class held below 1.40m at that same competition.

c. Any athlete competing in open jumper classes held at the USEF High Performance Standard or CSI3*, CSI4*, or CSI5* FEI Grand Prix classes offering \$25,000 or more in prize money are not eligible to compete in the highest money class, in the lowest height section of Junior and/or Amateur Jumpers offered at the same competition where more than one height section is offered for Junior and/or Amateur Jumpers.
