- Must be USEF licensed
- o Registered Judge (R): May officiate in any class in which they are licensed to judge.
- o **Recorded Judge (r):** Restrictions on r judges:
 - Hunters: Hunter A 'r' recorded judge may not officiate alone or independently in a Premier or National competition (Except in the following sections: Children's Hunter Horse/Pony, Adult Amateur Hunter, Low Children's Hunter Horse/Pony, Low Adult Amateur Hunter, Small Hunter, Thoroughbred Hunter, Ladies Side Saddle, Hunter Breeding and Pony Hunter Breeding, USHJA Hunters).
 - **Jumpers:** A 'r' recorded judge may not officiate alone or independently in a Jumper class offering more than \$2,500.
 - **Equitation**: A 'r' recorded judge may not officiate alone in a Federation Hunter Seat Medal Class, Show Jumping Talent Search class, or USHJA Jumping Seat Equitation Class at a Premier or National Rated Hunter competition.

□ C1 Steward

- Required for a H/J competition
- A recorded (r) Category 1 steward may not officiate alone in any National, Premier, or Special Event or in a Jumper division at competitions above Jumper Level 2 rating. A minimum of one Registered 'R' C1 Steward must officiate.

- Jumpers: An individual with a C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be present in the schooling area during any Jumper class offering \$10,000 to \$24,999 in prize money. For classes of \$25,000 or more, an individual with a Registered (R) Steward or Certified Jumper Schooling Supervisor license must be appointed to supervise schooling before and during the competition. The minimum number of required competition Steward (s) must always remain available to attend to other stewarding duties.
- Hunters: Competition Management is responsible for providing a Category 1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor to supervise schooling in the Hunter schooling area during any Hunter class offering \$10,000 or more in prize money, or any competition with a USHJA National/International Derby.

Course Designer

- A Licensed Hunter CD is required at a Premier or National rated competition. An "R" license is required if the competition has a hunter class offering \$5,000 or more in prize money (HU117). Otherwise, they can be "r".
- A Licensed Jumper CD is required at Jumper Level 2 or higher competition. An "R" license is required for Jumper classes offering \$25,000 or more in prize money (JP105.2).
- Course designers for Regional competitions must have a Hunter Course Designer Regional license.

☐ Hunter Breeding Judge

o If the competition has Hunter Breeding classes, it must have a Hunter Breeding judge. Hunter Breeding is now a designation on the 'R' Hunter license so the judge must be a 'R' HU judge with a Hunter Breeding designation.

□ Veterinarian

For Hunter/Jumper competitions, the vet must be on grounds if there were <u>200</u> horses competing the prior year or if it is a first year National or Premier rated competition.

□ Farrier

 A farrier(s) must be onsite for National and Premier rated competitions and may be on call for Regional competitions.

- □ Talen Search: The Talent Search is run at three different "star levels" and the prize list should indicate the level of the class.
- □ No prize money allowed to exhibitors for Equitation/Medal classes. (*Prize money may be awarded to trainers, and some in-kind gifts may be awarded to exhibitors. If offered in the prize list, confirm with Competition Licensing that this has been approved.*)
