## **EVALUATION OF SHOWJUMPING COURSES BY COURSE DESIGNER**

Name of Event: Carolina International CIC and Horse Trial

Was the Time Allowed changed for any of the Divisions, and if so by how much: Yes the TA in the 2\* was changed from 84 to 78 seconds

Give a brief description of any changes you would make if you had to build the same track again: I felt the 2\* and 3\* was bordering on too many changes of direction. The 2\* would have been more ideal with another straight line of jumps. The last jump in the 1\* should have been an oxer. The TA in the 3\* was a little loose.

Are there any other comments that you would like to offer about your courses: The faults were scattered throughout the courses and they seemed to ride fairly well. The courses would have benefited from being more technical but the Cross Country obstacles in the 2\* and 3\* arena added an element of precision that I felt made up for it.

The alternative was measured on the right hand turn which ended up being only a couple meters longer. The left turn was a more natural way to go but the jump # 9 in that direction went through the XC jump which was definitely more distracting. In the  $2^*$  about 75percent turned left. In the three star about 60 percent turned left.
