

USEF EVENTING PATHWAY PROGRAMS Eventing Development Program 2025 Criteria and Benefits

Vision of the Eventing Development Program:

The Eventing Development Program aims to identify and support Athlete/Horse combinations with the perceived talent and ability to move up to the Eventing Pre-Elite Program within the next 2-3 years by focusing on developing the skills needed to progress up the Pathway. Combinations are limited to a maximum of four (4) years in the Development Program.

Qualification Criteria for the Eventing Development Program:

Objective Program Criteria: Combinations that meet the vision of the Program will be eligible for the Development Program upon achievement of a competition result within the previous 12 months (December 1, 2024 - December 1, 2025), as defined below:

- Finish on a score ≤ 40 at a CCI5*-L
- Finish on a score ≤ 36 at a CCI4*-L
- Finish on a score ≤ 33 at a CCl3*-L Horses 7 y/o or younger:
 - Zero Cross-Country Jump and Time Penalties
- Finish on a score ≤ 30 at a CCI3*-L Horses 8 y/o or older:
 - o Zero Cross-Country Jump and Time Penalties

Athletes that are 25 or under (per FEI Regulations) for 2025 and achieve the criteria at a CCI3*-L will remain in the Development 25 Program. Athletes who have previously participated on an Eventing Olympic Games, FEI World Championship, or Pan American Games Team are ineligible for the Development or Development 25 Programs.

Exception: The Development Coach may identify Combinations that have not achieved a competition result per the objective criteria to participate in the Development Program.

Subjective Program Criteria: Athletes must show a commitment to learning and developing their personal or professional equestrian programs.

Program participation is voluntary, however, if an Athlete withdraws from the Development Program, they are not eligible to receive funding for the 2025 European Development Tour.

Criteria for Membership Retention to the Development Program:

Combinations having met the criteria will be invited to the Development Program. Combinations must partake in a required January Training Session to maintain membership in the Development Program. The Athlete must remain in good standing with US Equestrian. Development Program Membership will expire if the Athlete does not retain the ride on the Horse.

Athletes that are based in the U.S. will be required to participate in a 4-day training session in Ocala, Florida in January of the Program year. The training session will incorporate the Human (HSSM) and Equine (ESSM) Sports Science Medicine programs, as well as mounted training with the Development Coach.







Combinations are limited to a maximum of four (4) years in the Development Program. To maintain Development Program membership, Athletes must:

- Participate in 6-month reviews and work with the Development Coach to set competition targets and KPIs.
 - Meet targets and KPIs. If the targets or KPIs are not met, the Athlete must work with the Development Coach to create a performance plan that will lead to obtaining the targets and KPIs in the future.
- Communicate with the Development Coach on the status of their overall program, including veterinary updates, competition, and training plans.
- Maintain horsepower that is capable of meeting the Qualification Criteria for the Development Program.
- Plan for creating or obtaining horsepower to progress up the Eventing Pathway or and achieve longterm goals.

Benefits of the Eventing Development Program:

- Support from the USEF Development Coach for guidance and consultation on setting Key
 Performance Indicators, Individual Performance Plans, and personal program development to
 progress up the Eventing Pathway (training, strategic planning, setting competition and training
 targets, data analysis, etc.).
- Opportunity to participate in USEF training sessions/clinics/coaching sessions.
- Opportunity to participate in the USEF European Development Tour, and receive funding associated with the Tour.
- Access to USEF Human (HSSM) and Equine (ESSM) Sport Science Medicine programs and resources, when available. Including but not limited to the Veterinary Program, Team Farrier, Team Equine Physiotherapist, Team Human Physiotherapist, and access to USOPC Athlete Resources.
- Data analysis with EquiRatings.
- Inclusion on USEF press releases relating to the Eventing Pathway Programs and published on the www.usef.org website.
