



2025 NAYC Water Certificate of Capability

FEI North American Youth Championships

Junior and Young Rider Zone 10

July 29 - August 3, 2025

Zone 10 athlete/horse combinations wishing to compete in the 2024 NAYC must have earned two (2) Certificates of Capability as described below, at USEF or FEI licensed competitions between **September 1, 2024 and June 8, 2025**. *Please note that the height Certificate of Capability has been automated and does not require a paper form.* The two requirements (height and water) may be met either in the same or different courses.

1. North American Young Rider Championships:

- a. Each athlete/horse combination must earn a Certificate of Capability by completing a course set at 1.45m or higher with a score of four (4) faults or less.
- b. Each athlete/horse combination must earn a Certificate of Capability by completing a course at 1.30m or higher with a dug in three (3) meter open water jump with or without a rail. In either case, the jump must be in accordance with USEF JP129.

2. North American Junior Championships:

- a. Each athlete/horse combination must earn a Certificate of Capability by completing a course set at 1.40m or higher with a score of four (4) faults or less.
- b. Each athlete/horse combination must earn a Certificate of Capability by completing a course at 1.30m or higher with a dug in three (3) meter open water jump with or without a rail. In either case, the jump must be in accordance with USEF JP129.
